

President's Message

www.ewelcomed in the new year as CWL members on the 11th of February at our Opening Mass. The theme for 2020 is "Your work, Our hands". I would like to thank all who attended and made the first gathering a success.

Mass was celebrated by Fr Gerry Gleeson, as our Chaplain Fr Ray Farrell, I'm sad to report, is currently in Palliative care. Fr Ray has been at the heart of CWL Sydney for many years and integral to our organisation, so I ask you all to please keep Fr Ray in your prayers.

At the end of last year I was proud of the effort made by our Executive and Councillors to rally together and produce pamper packs for country women affected by the drought. No doubt these special gifts were able to bring some joy to the women who needed it most. In a very short time we made up 201 packs.

I would like to inform you that the CWL Sydney Council has voted to suspend the last four months of our Project of the Year, the Thanh Tam Special School in Vietnam, so as to fundraise instead for schools affected by the bushfires. Thanh Tam Special School has been our project for over 18 months, and we have made an amazing effort to support this school – they have been able to make a number of great improvements thanks to your hard work in fundraising for them. We believe we will be able to make equally as great an impact to our local schools affected by the fires and hope you will support this initiative by your continued fundraising.

Branches will still receive application forms for Project of the Year 2020/21, which will be voted on by the Council in June.

Lastly, I have to report that Sue Halliday on 11th February tendered her resignation as Manager of Marian Court and as Treasurer of CWL. Mr Anthony Watts has been appointed as the new Manager of Marian Court. Because of legal constraints around employees I am unable to discuss these developments at present.

PAMPER PACKS FOR LADIES OF THE LAND

Catholic Women's League Archdiocese of Sydney recently joined the initiative of Ladies of the Land NSW, packing shoe boxes full of pamper items and gifts for drought affected women in New South Wales.

During the drought women often put themselves last, so Ladies of the Land started the initiative of packaging up pamper goodies by putting them in a shoe box, wrapping the box in your local newspaper (so the recipient knows where you are from) and writing a small note with a personalised message of encouragement inside. Partnering with the Country Women's Association, the boxes will be distributed to women most affected by the drought.

We had three weeks to contact businesses, friends and family and what an amazing effort! Filling each shoe box with lovely items, we know the women will appreciate this special gift. From mini champagne bottles, eye make up, lip gloss, candles, magazines, chocolates, gift vouchers etc. – the generosity of our ladies was just amazing.

In only a few weeks we produced 201 shoe boxes, with many coming from St Andrews Malabar and St Agnes Matraville, decorated in pretty ribbons and dropped off in Bangor, Burwood and Rydalmere. From there they will be taken to country drop-off points for distribution.

When so many ask "how can I help?" this was one project that everyone supported and these families affected by the drought will be in our thoughts and prayers over the Christmas Season.

We hope that 2020 brings rain for our drought affected farming families and their animals.

Often small ideas can produce big results!

On January 10th we had a private audience with Pope Francis. After such a gift to WUCWO, I decided to tell you about this wonderful experience in this message for the month of February 2020.

The conversation focused on women in the Church. It was very nice to hear him talk about how he wrote the homily of January 1 of this year: he did so in one go, because it came out of his heart in this way; he also talked about how generally one thinks only of the "functionality" of women, and it is necessary to open also the other field proper to "being," that is the femininity of women; about how he longs for our active participation in the synodal experience the Church is carrying on; about why the strongest ideological threat of this time is the ideology of gender. At the end he added: "It is women who carry the Church forward without holding official positions."

At the end of the meeting, he gave us a blessing for each one of you, your families, organisations and countries. He left us a very encouraging message, which filled us with joy and strength: "Take charge with courage! Look at Mary Magdalene: she was a little crazy, because she announced to the apostles the Resurrection of Jesus, even if they refused to believe her. Without craziness there is no holiness."
